Your Concerns, Our Actions

Adaptive Learning Platform (ALP)

Last year, we reported here that HKAHSS secured sponsorship from WYNG Foundation to incubate an Adaptive Learning Platform on Mathematics (S.4 – S.6). The construction work officially began in late July 2019 with the following features:

1. It is multifunctional. It can serve as a self-studying platform, a teaching-learning platform and an assessment platform.
2. Artificial Intelligence will be applied.
3. Gamification will be an important feature.
4. Social Learning will be encouraged through the system.
5. Intelligent Tutoring will be provided in the system.

We expect that the building of the system will take 12 to 18 months and we will earnestly elicit your support when the system is officially launched.

Annual Conferences

We hold Annual Conference and AGM cum Conference every year in June and December respectively. These are effective platforms for us to meet each other and to share views with professionals on some very hot issues that affect education.

The Annual General Meeting held on 3 December 2019 was well received with 149 members attended. The keynote speech was delivered by Professor Lee Lap-fung Francis on “The Leaderless Generation (無大台新世代)”.

The Annual Conference was held on 29 June 2020 with Mr. Tsang Yok-sing Jasper and Professor Shen Xu-hui Simon as the keynote speakers sharing their views on “Hong Kong · A Momentous Change (香港變局)”. The conference was well-received and more than 119 members attended.

Continuing Professional Development (CPD)

The CPD group has been working conscientiously on the professional development of our members. In 2019-20, various activities were held to cater for members' needs.

Online Retreat for Members

Due to COVID-19, our plan to hold a retreat for members couldn't be realized. However, our passion for serving members is not being deterred in anyway. We made our first attempt on organizing an online retreat titled "Unprecedented Challenges (從未如此經歷過) ..." which was held on 21 September 2020 with 68 participants. The programme was conducted by Rev. Fr. Kwan Tsun-tong Thomas. In the online retreat, participants had very inspiring input with good personal quiet time and group discussion. We will still work on holding a face-to-face retreat for members to further explore the topic and hopefully it would be held in the first half of 2021.

Principals' Online Resources Corner

The HKAHSS Principals' Online Resources Corner is set up on trial and it is now open to those members who had joined our retreat in 2018 on a voluntary basis for 2 years. If this trial runs well, we may consider further opening the Corner to other members.

Helpline for Members

A new project "Helpline for Members" was launched in the AGM 2019 to better serve our members. The Helpline is set up to provide more personal contact on top of our regular sunshine calls to the newly-appointed principals. While the Helpline might touch on difficulties encountered by members with regard to their school work, it caters for our members' psychological and emotional needs as well. 5 helpers are playing their roles as a companion (同行者). In very challenging times like the last few months, we received a number of enquiries and calls. Newly-appointed Principals (NAPs)

We have already established very solid work on serving the NAPs. Before their official assumption of office, NAPs have already received a welcoming note from the Chairman followed by sunshine calls from our Executive Committee. A Tea Gathering was specially held for them on 15 September 2020. The gathering helped build relationships and networking that provided them with support and encouragement as the challenges to start the new school year during a period of school suspension were great. 35 NAPs registered and the attendance rate was 100%. There were presentations on issues related to school resumption and student support services. Besides, there was ample time for group discussion. In view of the ever-increasing demands on education, we are constantly exploring and developing opportunities for our members to sharpen our professional knowledge and skills to work for the betterment of our younger generations.

Curriculum Review and Development (CRD)

The CRD group has taken the initiative to proactively explore the direction of Hong Kong curriculum development. In 2019-20, we have covered a lot of grounds including completion of a research on curriculum reform and organization of an academic forum to encourage professional dialogues on curriculum development in Hong Kong.

Survey findings on “Curriculum Reform – Shaping the Future” [CUHK & HKAHSS]

On 16 January 2020, we held a press conference publicizing the findings of the research jointly conducted by the Hong Kong Centre for International Student Assessment (HKCISA) at The Chinese University of Hong Kong and HKAHSS on the “Survey on the Curriculum Reform: From Present to the Future”. The survey was completed by 183 principals and 1,158 teachers from 213 secondary schools, in which their opinions on the effects, implementation and difficulties of the existing secondary curriculum policy, and their views about the need for a future curriculum were collected. The findings revealed the majority of Hong Kong educators agreed that the most important aim of the future secondary curriculum would be to improve students’ transversal and transformative competencies and generic skills and to strengthen life education and values education. The following suggestions were made: Our curriculum should allow greater flexibility, break the existing boundaries and embrace universal values to develop the “soft power” of our students.

Academic Forum on History Education in Hong Kong: Yesterday, Today & Tomorrow
(香港歷史教育：昨天、今天、明天)[CUHK & HKAHSS]

An Academic Forum on History Education in Hong Kong was held successfully on 22 October 2020. It was jointly organised with the Department of Curriculum and Instruction, Faculty of Education, The Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK). There were more than 180 participants including professors, principals, vice principals, curriculum leaders, History teachers, Chinese History teachers and student teachers. We were very honoured to have three speakers to share their views on History Education in Hong Kong and lead us to reflect on our professional roles. Professor Tsang Wing-kwong (Adjunct Professor, Department of Educational Administration and Policy, Faculty of Education, CUHK) discussed the professional roles of HKSAR History Teachers and their awareness on history. He shared the readings of different scholars. Professor Yip Hon-ming (Adjunct Professor (Honorary), Department of History, CUHK) used her personal teaching experience to reflect on the paradox involved and gave tips to the participants on how to help students learn and study history. Ms Lee Suet-kam (Vice Principal, Liu Po Shan Memorial College) shared with the participants on “History Education: Within and Without” from a frontline teacher’s perspective. The Open Forum brought the Academic Forum to a close with professional dialogue and passion for education and students.

Policy and Strategic Planning (P&SP)

This Task Group was formally established in August 2020 based on the following considerations:

1. In view of the recent social and political contentions, the ecology in the education arena has become increasingly complicated. We have come to a very critical period which might put educators’ professionalism and autonomy at risk.
2. The situation and its development do pose much concern and certainly demand the very vigilant and immediate responses from the Association with professional angles and analyses.
3. In order to support colleagues serving in the frontline to stand tall in face of social and political challenges, it is important for us to be alert, sensitive to any issues or concerns that will affect the landscape of education in Hong Kong. Foresight and insight together with proactivity are essential core elements we should prepare to meet challenges.

4. To safeguard educators' professionalism and autonomy, it is imperative for the Executive Committee members, and hopefully our members, to possess the calibre to discern issues from professional and educational angles, which is a result of continued exposure, deliberation, discipline and training. The Association should provide a platform for such awareness, exposure, training and nurture.

The Task Force's scope of work is basically:

1. To be alert and think in advance the issues of concerns arising from social and political contentions, the enactment of the National Anthem Law and National Security Law, and relevant educational policies issued by the government.
2. To study and assess the impacts of such issues on schools, education provisions and educators' professionalism and autonomy.
3. To study on how similar issues are handled and addressed in other countries or regions and review relevant literatures to gain insight and enlightenment to ensure views, comments or proposals made on relevant issues are substantial and appropriate.
4. To advise the Executive Committee on stance and action to take.
5. To carry out any action (such as writing papers, holding forums, press conferences, social advocacy etc.) as resolved and entrusted in the Executive Committee.

Research & Development (R&D)

The R&D Task Group continued to serve the aim to foster the professionalism of HKAHSS. The ever-changing ecology in the education arena in recent years does demand very vigilant and immediate responses from the Association with professional angles and analyses. The ultimate challenge will be our ability to lead and define what education is and how it should be done. In face of these demands, foresight and insight together with proactivity are essential core elements to develop among ourselves.

This year, the R&D Task Group, which serves as the Think Tank of the Association, has focused on the following:

1. To continue our consistent efforts, our Group has thoroughly discussed and thrashed out key issues which should be considered and incorporated in CE's 2020 Policy Address. Key issues are as follows:
 - a. Ensure that "Suspension of Classes" really means "No Suspension of Learning"
 - b. Reduce the Impact of the Social Movement on Students and Schools
 - c. Trust Schools; Respect the Education Profession

2. Our concern for professional recognition and status of educators

After 3 years of discussion and preparation, we have embarked on our work on a research titled: "*HOW TO PROMOTE THE PROFESSIONAL STATUS AND SOCIAL RECOGNITION OF SECONDARY SCHOOL TEACHERS IN HONG KONG*". The Hong Kong Policy Research Institute (HKPRI) has been commissioned for the research and we are at its final stage. The final report is expected to be released in the first quarter of 2021 with recommendations on follow up action. We thank schools for helping with the data collection process.

Self-Regulated Learning (SRL)

SRL3.0 Lesson Study Project

To promote more effective professional sharing, 5 Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) (namely Chinese Language, English Language, Mathematics, Economics and Liberal Studies) have been formed. 15 schools with 13 principals and 36 teachers collaborated in the 5 PLCs with an aim to improve learning and teaching effectiveness through focused lesson study projects. The SRL task group and the Chinese University of Hong Kong jointly organized a pilot study on "Using Outside Class e-Learning Activities to Promote Students' Self-Regulated Learning of Classical Chinese (以課外電子學習活動促進學生對文言課文的自主學習)" and there were 5 schools joining this study. Due to COVID-19, lesson observations and study of the aforementioned project were affected. Some of the groups have revised their schedule and will continue the project in the school year of 2020-21.

SRL Festival and Joint-school Professional Development Day

In SRL Festival 2019-20, 114 open classes were held successfully and 925 teachers participated. However, 33 lessons were cancelled due to the social incidents.

SRL Festival 2020-21 was scheduled to be held between November 2020 and January 2021. A total of 135 open classes would be offered by 27 schools. An online workshop was organized on 15 October 2020 to discuss how to conduct SRL lesson observation and post-lesson conference effectively.

Due to COVID-19, our Joint-school SRL Professional Development Day on 14 February 2020 was cancelled. We have planned to hold the joint-school development day on 8 February 2021.

The New Normal: Suspending Classes without Suspending Learning

To maintain professional dialogues and promote SRL during the class suspension period, an online professional sharing was held on 3 March 2020. The sharing, titled “Suspending Classes without Suspending Learning: Planning, Practices and Problems”, was organized for member schools, with 104 participants from 40 schools. We are very pleased that principals and teachers had professional dialogues and mutual support on teaching ideas, administrative arrangements and valuable school experiences for this new normal in Hong Kong.

SRL Network Schools Reunion Workshop

In order to further strengthen and enlighten the development of the SRL network schools, we organized a reunion workshop to facilitate the sustainable development for SRL schools and to evaluate the effectiveness of SRL work in schools on 6 July 2020. 40 teachers from 5 network schools made reflections on their experiences during the school suspension and exchanged their ideas in SRL development.
